High school and homeschool students in the NSDA and NCFCA leagues have US/China policy reform as their debate topic. Are the benefits of cross-border trade and investment for people in China and in the US worth the costs? Some companies in China and in the U.S. struggle to compete with imports. Consumers benefit from wider options but wonder about jobs "lost."

Understanding and communicating the benefits, costs, and dynamics of international trade, along with other economic freedoms, can reduce the dangers and damage from protectionists and nationalists.
