Re: Your request to resign membership in the Michigan Education Association

There is a process for membership resignation that you will need to follow should you decide to resign your membership. That process is as follows:

Continuing membership in the Association shall be terminated at the request of a member when such a request is submitted to the Association in writing, signed by the member and <u>postmarked</u> between August 1 and August 31 of the year preceding the designated membership year.

To assure that we affect to correct record, please state what school district you work in. Additionally, we recommend you send that communication to us using **certified mail**. Although it is not required to use certified mail, we have found that it is always best to be able to verify time sensitive communications.

We are concerned that you want to resign your membership in the MEA and we would like to know if you would be willing to share with us your reasons for resigning. All organizations need feedback and we cannot improve if we do not know what our members want to see.
